- ♦ ATTENDANCE and SCHOOL TIMES—The school day starts at 8.50am, with the gates to classes opening at 8.45am, so please make sure your child is on time in the mornings ready to start their learning; children that are late to school can incur a half day (session) unauthorised absence as stated in the Department for Education School Attendance guidance. The Spring term is a shorter period in the academic year and it is important that we maximise attendance to ensure our pupils continue to make progress. Inevitably, attendance will continue to be impacted by Covid and it is essential that we all take precautions and minimise the spread of the latest variant which is highly infectious. Please inform the school if your child is absent with the valid reason. The school has a duty of care to investigate any absence for the safety of the child. - BOOKS, BOOKS, BOOKS!—We really hope your children enjoyed their present of a book from the Christmas Elf, which was funded by the PTA. Year 5 and 6 also received books as part of the Chichester Reading Festival and were able to ask the authors questions; a fabulous opportunity to enjoy new books.
- COVID19—Thank you for your continued support through the pandemic. The government has issued further guidance with regards to PCR tests, it states that: Confirmatory PCR tests following a positive lateral flow device (LFD) test result are to be temporarily suspended from Tuesday 11 January. This will

mean that anyone who receives a positive LFD test result will be required to self-isolate immediately and will not be required to take a confirmatory PCR test. This is a temporary measure while COVID-19 rates remain high across the UK. Lateral flow tests are taken by people who do not have COVID-19 symptoms. Anyone who develops 1 of the 3 main COVID-19 symptoms should stay at home and self-isolate and take a PCR test. They must selfisolate if they get a positive test result, even if they have had a recent negative lateral flow test – these rules have not changed. The self-isolation advice for people with coronavirus (COVID-19) has also changed. It is now possible to end self-isolation after 7 days, <u>following 2 negative LFD tests taken 24 hours apart.</u> The first LFD test should not be taken before the sixth day.

- LUNCH PLAY—A reminder that if your child has wellington boots in school they may use the school field at lunchtimes. Using the field means children have more space to play and enjoy our school grounds. Wellington boot pegs are available to store the boots.
