Welcome to our October newsletter. It is nearly half term already so we wanted to update you with some information and dates as the second half of the autumn term can become busy!

- ◆ **HARVEST**— Thank you for all your generous donations for our harvest festival this year, supporting our local food bank which serves our local community.
- ◆ **OPEN MORNING**—We would like to welcome parents and carers to our open morning on Thursday 19th October 9am-10am. You are invited into your child's class to work alongside them for some of the lesson if you are able to.
- ◆ **WELLIES AND COATS** —Please ensure your child has a named warm coat for break times and outdoor learning. We prefer our children to use all the space available to them at breaks, including the school field, so as it gets wetter under foot we will ask for wellington boots only on the field. If your child would like to bring in a named pair that can be left in school they can then enjoy the space.
- ◆ **READING MILES**—Our reading miles certificates this year are based on the theme of mountains. A reading mile certificate is gained every 25 times a child reads with an adult shown by the signed record in their homework diary. A love and enjoyment of reading is important for our children, so we encourage you to continue to spend time with your child, sharing a positive experience of books together. Ask your child what book the teacher is reading this half term!
- ◆ **MENTAL HEALTH & WELLBEING DAY**—As mentioned in the September newsletter, Tuesday 10th October is mental health and wellbeing day. Children may wear something yellow to school with their school uniform, such as a T-shirt, gloves, scarf, hair accessory, a badge.
- ◆ **BIKES & SCOOTERS**—A polite reminder that bikes and scooters are not to be ridden up the alleyway and on the school site as it is too busy with so many parents, carers, grandparents and toddlers. Please dismount from scooters and bikes before entering the alleyway and school premises, thank you.
- ◆ **PARENTS' EVENING**—Our parent consultation evenings are on 1st and 2nd November, please book a consultation with your child's teacher through the reply slip on the parent consultation letter.
