These are the words that will help you think, speak and write like a geographer.

<b>agriculture</b>	Farming: animals (livestock) and growing and harvesting crops
<b>business</b>	An organisation where people work together
<b>change</b>	The process through which something becomes different
<b>climate</b>	An area's long-term weather patterns
<b>comparison</b>	Finding similarities
<b>continent</b>	A large, continuous land mass
<b>country</b>	An area of land controlled by a single government
<b>county</b>	A small area of the UK, eg West Sussex; Hampshire
<b>development</b>	Growth; change
<b>distribution</b>	The way something is spread out or arranged in an area

<b>environment</b>	Everything around us, both living and nonliving
<b>feature</b>	A noticeable or important part of something
<b>industry</b>	A group of businesses that produce particular goods
<b>leisure</b>	Free time
<b>location</b>	Where something is
<b>population</b>	The number of people living in a certain place
<b>rural</b>	An area with a low population, usually in the countryside
<b>settlement</b>	A place where people live and work
<b>tourism</b>	People travelling to experience another place
<b>urban</b>	An area where many people live and work close together

<b>Human Geography</b>	The study of societies, cultures and economies.
<b>Physical Geography</b>	The study of landscapes and environments.
<b>Environmental Geography</b>	The study of how humans impact the Earth.
